# PORTLAND

## PORTLAND CASCADE (8-4) at CHICAGO BANDITS (6-7)

Tuesday, June 30, 2026 • 4 p.m. PT • Parkway Bank Sports Complex • Rosemont, Illinois  
 Sam Landry (3-1, 1.15) vs. Lexi Kilfoyl (1-0, 0.00)

**LEADING THE WAY:** Starting pitcher **Sam Landry** leads all pitchers with over 10 innings pitched with a 1.11 ERA. Landry has appeared in six games, starting four games and completing three of them. In her six appearances, Landry has not given up more than two runs in any appearance ... reliever **Payton Gottshall** is second in ERA among pitchers with more than 10 innings pitched at 1.24.

**FULL STRENGTH AT LAST:** The Cascade will begin their series at Texas with their full roster, after pitcher **Carley Hoover** and catcher **Mia Davidson** join Portland after completing their respective seasons in Japan ... Hoover picked up the win against Texas in her first appearance, pitching five shutout innings.

**GOING THE DISTANCE:** Portland handed the reigning champions, the Utah Talons, their first and only three losses of the season, led by **Sam Landry, Kenzie Brown and Kelly Maxwell** who combined for 20.1 inning in their starts against the Talons, striking out a combined 17 batters while only giving up a combined four runs in the series.

**A WINNING FORMULA:** The Portland Cascade rattled off the second longest win streak in AUSL history with **Korbe Otis** batting in the leadoff spot. Over those five games Otis reached base in every game and batted in nine runs. The Cascade are 5-1 in the six games that Otis has led off.

**A PLACE TO CALL HOME:** Portland earned its first win at home in front of a sold-out crowd in the home opener. Starting pitcher **Sam Landry** became the second pitcher in AUSL regular season history to pitch a complete game shutout, joining **Georgina Corrick** who has accomplished the feat twice. .

**RECIPE FOR SUCCESS:** “Chef” **Megan Grant** may not be in college anymore, but after setting the NCAA record for home runs in a season (42) she is off to a hot start in the AUSL, with two home runs so far this season. .

**THERE IS A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING:** In her debut performance in the AUSL, **Kenzie Brown** managed to secure the Cascade’s first win in franchise history, pitching the full five innings and striking out a handful of Blaze batters. In her second performance, Brown became the first pitcher in AUSL history with double digit strikeouts in a game.

**WHEN IT RAINS, IT POURS:** The Cascade were able to find their groove in the second inning of the final game against the Blaze on their way to a dozen runs. The most runs scored in a single inning in AUSL history. Center fielder **Kendra Falby** contributed a pair of RBI singles, but the Cascade were led by **Korbe Otis**, who after hitting an RBI single in her first at-bat of the inning, capped the scoring with a grand slam in her second at-bat.

**NOT TO BE TAKEN FOR GRANTED:** After setting the single season home run record in her senior season at UCLA, **Megan Grant** hit a two-run home run in her second at bat with the Cascade which is the new longest home run in AUSL history at 313’.

**A NEW FRANCHISE BUDS IN ROSE CITY:** Portland is now home to franchises in three of the largest women’s sports leagues. The Cascade join the Thorns (National Women’s Soccer League) and the Fire (WNBA) as major women’s franchises to call the City of Roses home.

**PITCHING AT A PREMIUM:** The Cascade used their first selections in the Expansion Draft and the Allocation Draft last December to select pitchers, choosing **Sam Landry** and **Kelly Maxwell**, respectively. Landry was the No. 1 overall selection by the Volts in the 2025 College Draft. Maxwell, meanwhile, piloted Team USA to a Gold medal at the 2025 World Games.

**NEW LEAGUE, NEW RECORDS TO SET:** **Megan Grant** was selected with the No. 4 overall pick in the 2026 AUSL College Draft after a record-setting career at UCLA where she set an NCAA record with 42 home runs as a senior and finished as the Bruins’ all-time leader with 91 career home runs.

**REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK:** The Bandits took down Oklahoma City 14-0 on Saturday, tying the AUSL record with 14 runs in a single game.

**BRING OUT THE BROOMS:** The Bandits earned their first sweep of the 2026 season this weekend after combining for 22 runs on 25 hits in a two-game set with the Spark. The sweep was just the second in team history, joining their three-game sweep over the Volts from June 12-14 in 2025.

**CENTURY MARK:** The Bandits became the first team to reach the 100 hit-mark this season after recording 25 hits in their sweep of the Spark. Chicago leads the AUSL with 102 hits, 64 runs, and 23 doubles, and their team average of .302 and on-base percentage of .406 sit nearly 40 and 60 points higher than the next closest teams.

**FROM MIA TO MVP:** Infielder **Sami Williams** spent 1,745 days between appearances in the AUSL after making two appearances in 2021, but she has been unbelievable in 2026. Williams is one of the favorites to win the league MVP as she currently leads the AUSL in hits (18), doubles (7), and RBIs (64), and she ranks top-5 in average (0.514), on-base percentage (.600), slugging (1.114), OPS (1.714), runs scored (11), and home runs (4).

**QUADRUPLE DIGIT CLUB:** The Bandits have four players who have an OPS over 1.000 this season. Infielders **Skylar Wallace** and **Sami Williams** are currently ranked #1 and #2 in the AUSL with OPS values of 1.738 and 1.714. Infielders **Mac Barbara** and **Erin Coffel** also rank top-9 in the AUSL this season at 1.159 and 1.223.

**POWER SURGE:** After leaving the yard just two times in their first four games, Chicago has ripped 13 home runs in their last nine games, including a team-high four home runs by infielder **Sami Williams**. The Bandits led the league with 38 home runs last summer, which were 12 more homers than the next closest team.

**RETURN OF THE ACE:** Pitcher **Lexi Kilfoyl** returned to the circle for the first time on Saturday, and she shut down one of the top offenses in the league with 5.0 shutout innings, striking out two while allowing just four hits.

**ACE IN THE CIRCLE:** Pitcher **Amber Fiser** has been one of the top starters in the AUSL this season. In her first six appearances, Fiser has thrown the second-most innings in the AUSL with 30.0 innings pitched and 20 strikeouts while allowing opponents to hit just .224. Fiser has compiled a 3.03 ERA and a 1.17 WHIP on the year.

**STREAKING SKYLAR:** Infielder **Skylar Wallace** is currently riding a 13-game hitting streak, dating back to July 8 of last season, after recording five hits in her first three games. Wallace has recorded a hit in 24 of her 26 career games in the regular season, and her 13-game hitting streak is one of only three to reach double digits in AUSL history, joining Maya Brady (16 from 7/16/2025 to 6/21/2026) and Wallace (11 from 6/8/2025 to 6/23/2025).

**RETURNING TO THE TOP:** Infielder **Erin Coffel** returns to the field in Rosemont after being named the AUSL Most Valuable Player and Hitter of the Year last summer. Coffel is currently leading the league with 11 walks, and she is ranked top-3 in the league with 5 doubles and a .578 on-base percentage, reaching in 26 of her 45 chances.

**FOUR SCORE:** The Chicago Bandits are 17-1 in regular season games when holding their opponents to four runs or fewer, including the 11-3, 5-4, 4-3, 5-1, and 14-0 victories in their four wins this season.

**LIVING UP TO THEIR NAME:** The Chicago Bandits lead the AUSL with nine stolen bases this season, including a league-high three steals from outfielder **Morgan Zerkle**.

**MOWING THEM DOWN:** Pitcher **Amber Fiser** made history earlier this year, striking out a Bandits' record seven batters against the Spark. Fiser earned her first career win with a complete game, allowing only one unearned run.

**ONLY TAKES ONE:** The Bandits are 6-0 in one-run games against teams not named the Utah Talons over the past two seasons, but they are 0-5 against the Talons in one-run games.

**MIXING IT UP:** The Bandits only have two players who have started in the same position in each game in 2026 with **Ailana Agbayani** starting each game at second base and **Sami Williams** starting at third base.
